Dozens of homes have been connected in the past few weeks and many more are

being scheduled. Fiber is still being installed on the utility poles and has not been completed in all parts of town—this work will continue into June. As each section of town is completed, homes will be scheduled for installation.

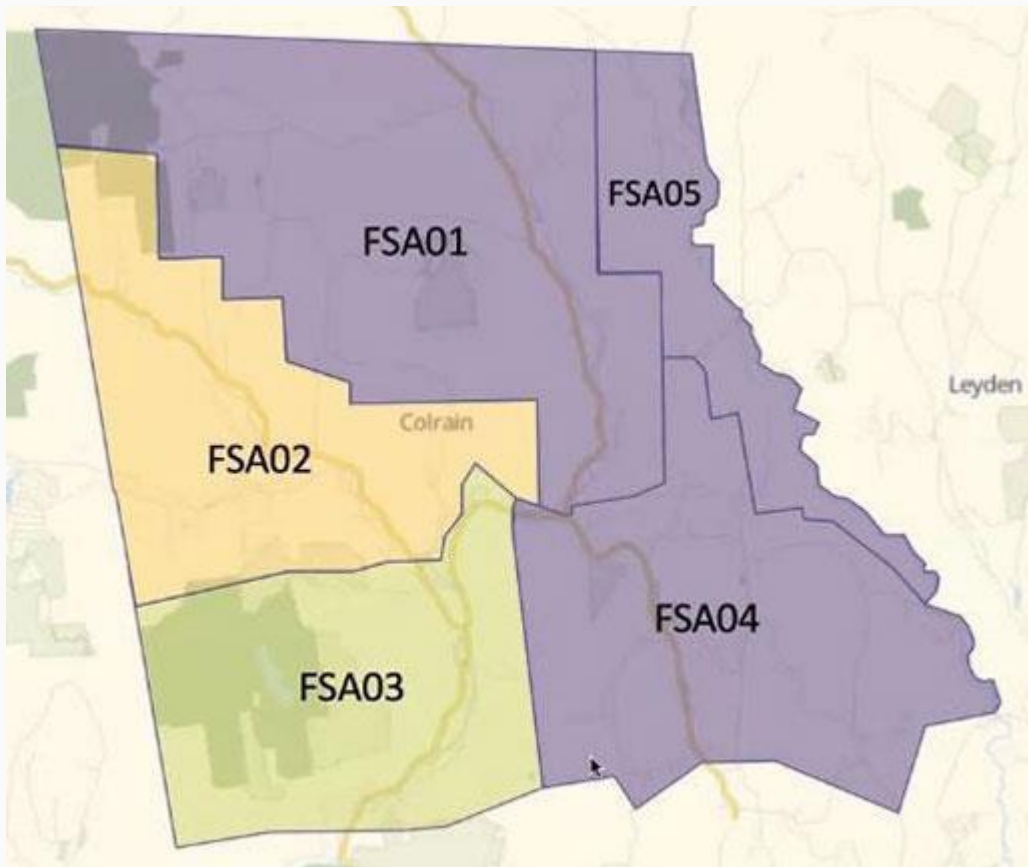
Sixty-plus Colrain residents participated in a webinar hosted March 24th by WhipCity Fiber and Colrain Broadband to hear the latest.

Questions about details ranged from the best place in your house to locate your new router and how long a typical installation takes, to learning more about WhipCity Fiber (a municipal electric company in Westfield) and who to call for problems.

LifePath Vaccination Access Helpline (413-829-9285) is available to provide assistance with vaccination registration to those who do not have internet access or computer skills, need transportation services to their vaccination appointment, or are not able to leave their homes to attend a vaccination clinic.

Anyone who leaves a message will receive a call back from one of the volunteers when local appointments are available.

Right now, though, there is little to no appointment availability in our area. Everyone who wants an appointment will get one, but it may take time.

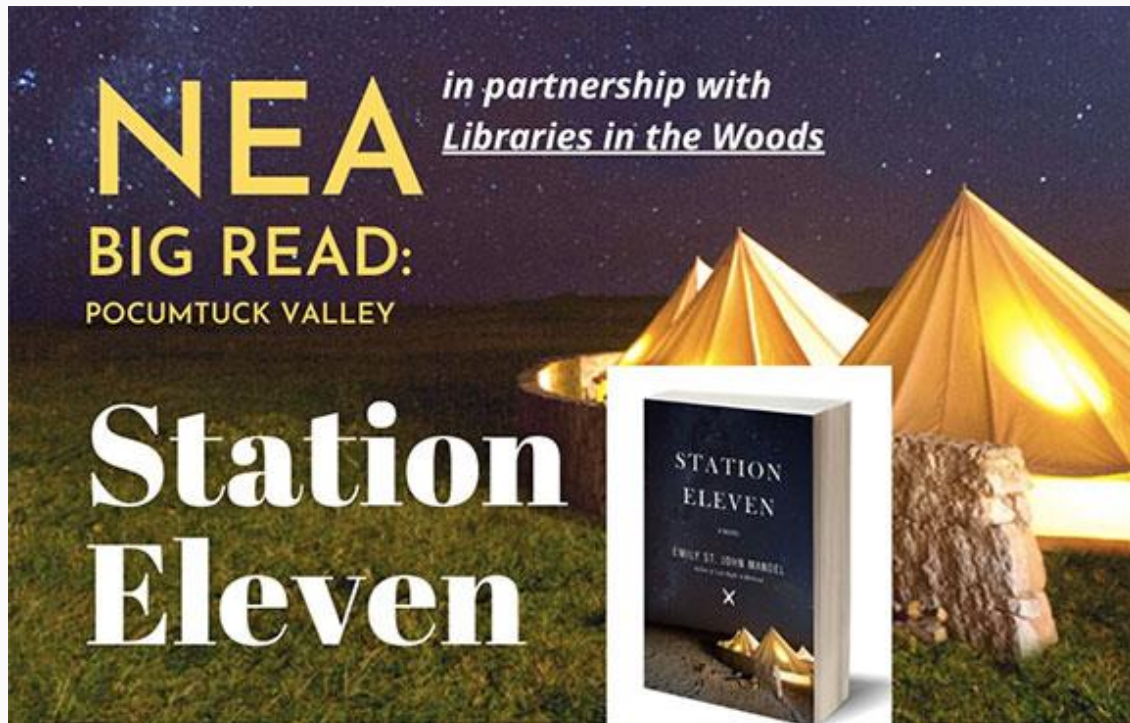

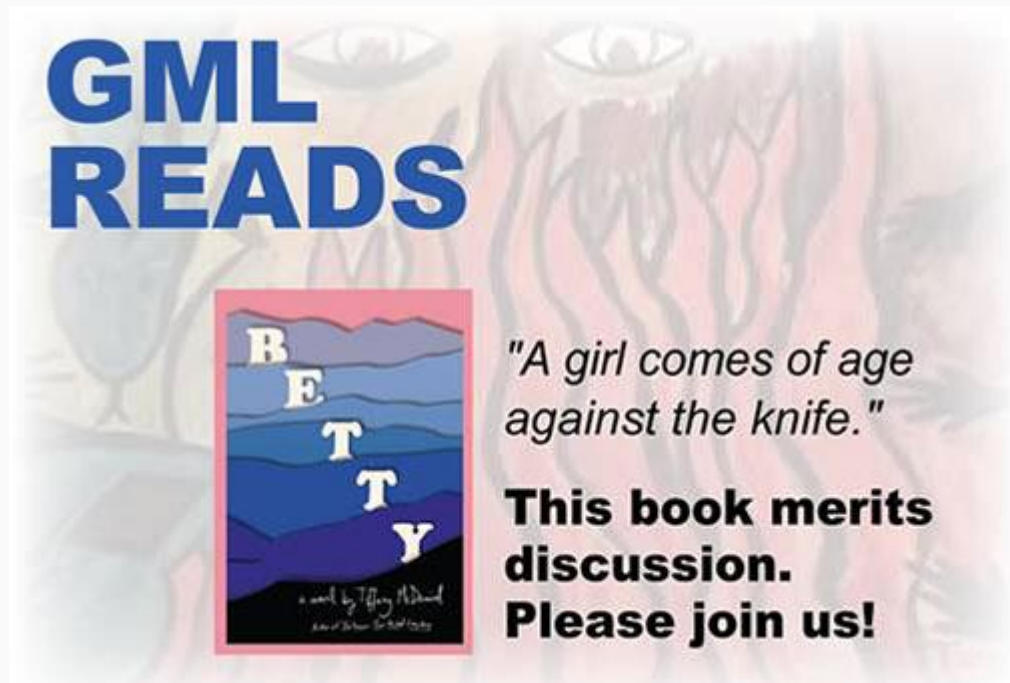

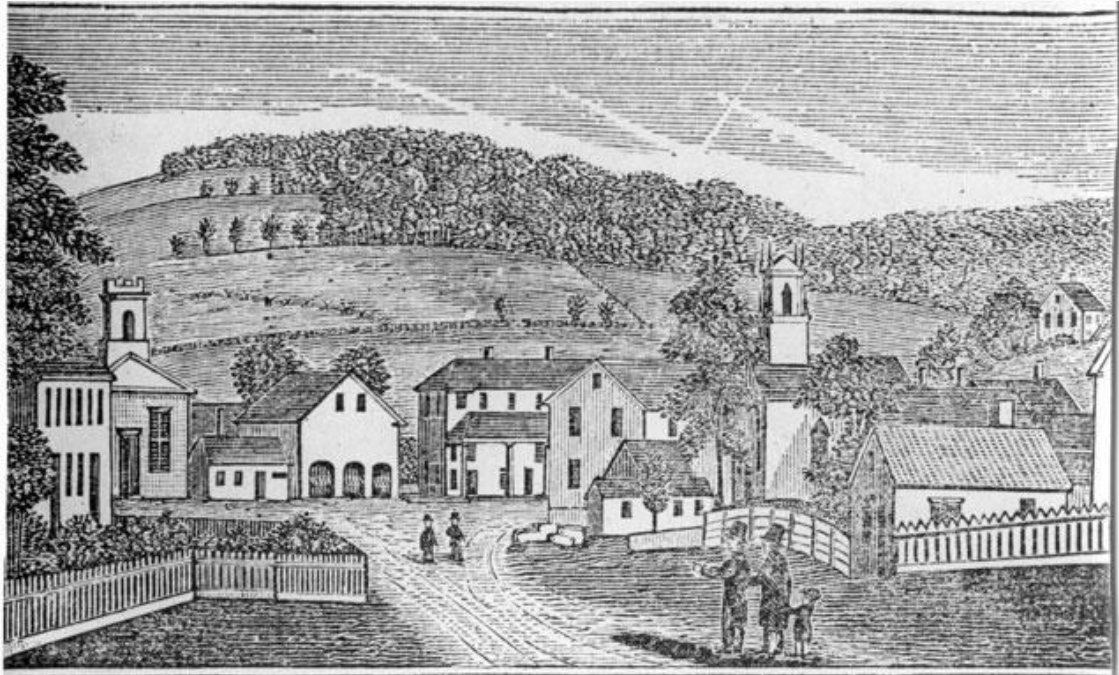

A Look Back



Western view of Coleraine, (central part.)

Probably the earliest rendering of Colrain center, this linecut from a book in the 1840s shows no town common and an open pasture behind the new Congregational Church with a truncated steeple. The common with graceful elms came later, still later in 1896 the trolley tracks, and in 1928 a paved road when the tracks were torn up. Over the coming year the common will extend north as state crews reconfigure the intersection there.

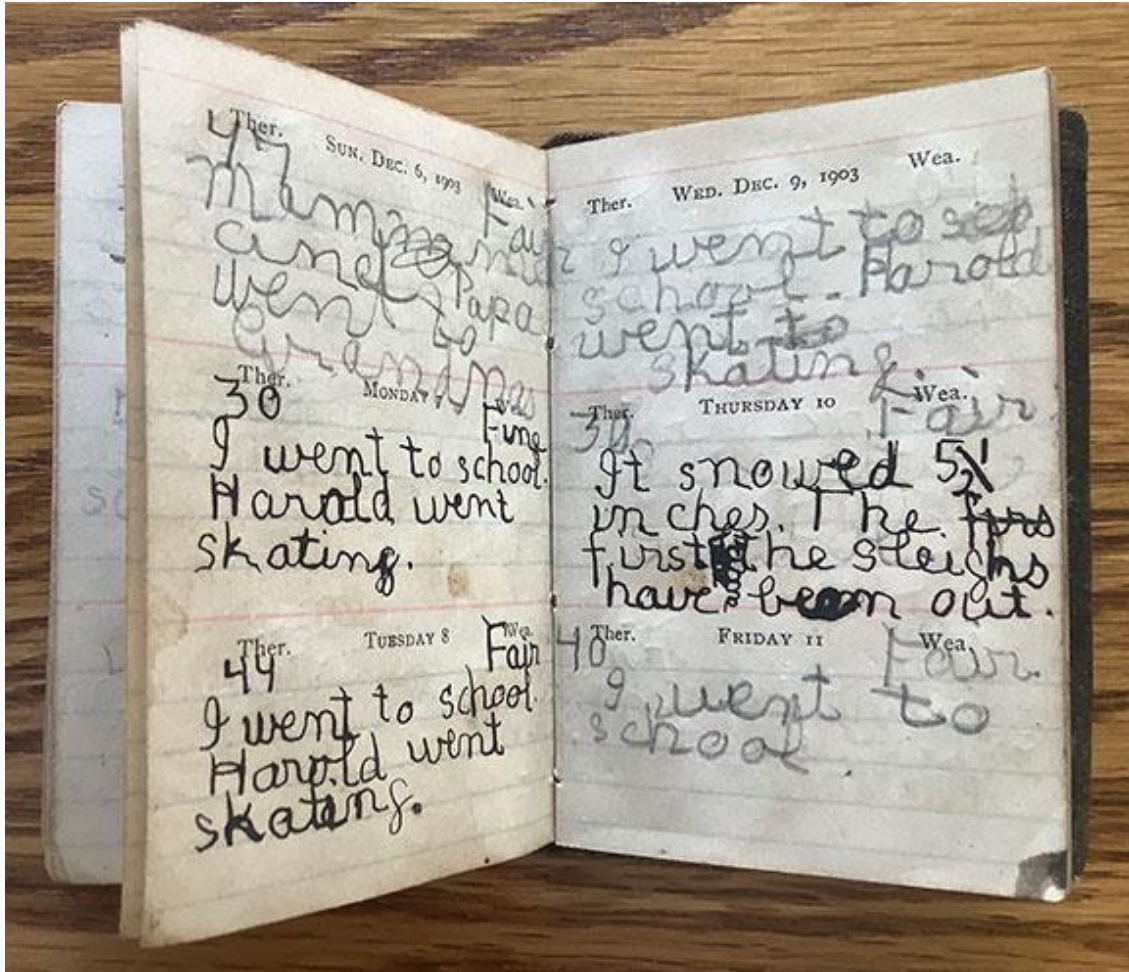

Catamont Hill Association—

The Diary of Hap Davenport

A tiny diary measuring only 2 1/4" by 3 1/4" is the newest addition to the Catamont Hill Association's archive. It was faithfully kept by the 7-year-old Elmer "Hap" Davenport starting January 1, 1903.

Hap was a great-grandson of Paul Davenport, the Revolutionary War veteran who donated land where the Catamount Hill schoolhouse stood. After graduation from Brown University in 1916, Hap taught at Deerfield Academy. Later, he received a Master's degree from Columbia University and became a school superintendent in Thomaston, Connecticut. He also authored two local histories, *As You Were Shelburne* and *The Puzzle of Catamount Hill*.



In his diary Hap Davenport (1895-1969) noted the weather and events of the day. Here are some sample entries with their original spellings and capitalization.

Jan. 19 fair. Papa went to annual bank meeting

Feb. 5 Cold wind I got a letter from Jennie

Mar. 18 cloudy I went down to the church supper and did not much to eat

April 20 present The school did not keep today

May 2 Fair We took the carriage to Noise to be polit

May 4 Fair Williams wagon most went over the wall.

June 6 Fine I went on a picknic

July 4 Warm Fine I had 3 bunches of fire-crackers

Aug. 11 Fine We went to catamount haying.

Sept. 17 Fine I went to cattle show

Nov. 9 Fine I had some bear meat. I played foot ball.

Dec. 10 fair It snowed 5 1/2 inches. The first the sleighs have been out

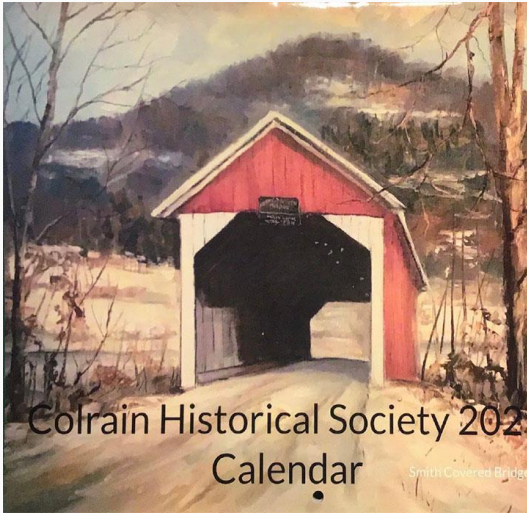
