Not yet connected, and will have underground service? If you signed up for service recently, or plan to do so in the coming winter months, please be aware that if you have an underground service to your home, the installation will very likely need to be delayed until the ground thaws in the spring.

Revised Drop/Install Policy: As of November 1, 2021, the allowance offered by the Town to cover some of the costs of a connection was reduced to \$650. The allowance will be offered as long as the Town is financially able.

More Bandwidth: With the increasing number of users, the bandwidth has been doubled. That means that even during times of very heavy usage, delays in uploading and downloading files and streaming will rarely occur.

Enhanced Reliability: The next major step the Colrain Broadband Board is working on is to ensure the system has redundancy, so that if there is an interruption of the fiber route carrying our signals, then a second backup route is automatically available.

Annual town street list form - coming to your doors in January

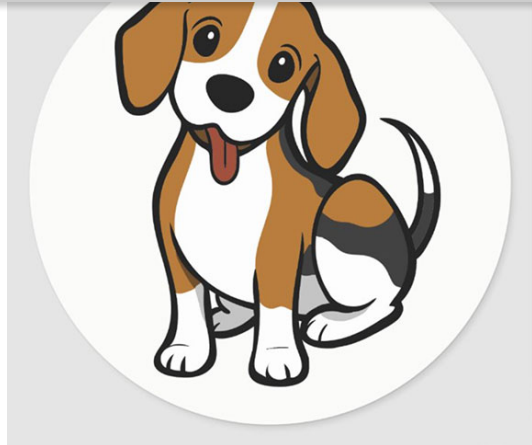
Please complete and return your forms to the town office. The Town needs this information:

- So police and fire departments can respond appropriately in an emergency.
- To compile the school list, dog list, and to maintain a census for the town.
- To apply for grants, and ensure Colrain receives adequate State and Federal Funding, which is based on the population.

NOTE: failure to respond to the mailing will result in removal from the active voting list (you would still be able to vote but only after completing an Affirmation of Current and Continuous Residence form).

Dog Owners! Licenses are available after January 1st.

All dogs 6 months and older must be licensed. You will need a current rabies certificate to obtain your license.



- Spayed and neutered dog licenses are \$5.00.
- Female and male dogs not neutered or spayed are \$10.00.
- Kennel (1-4) \$20, (5-10) \$35, (over 10 dogs) \$50.
- Licenses expire every year on MARCH 31ST. Late fees of \$10 per dog after April 1st and \$25 per dog after May 1st will be assessed.

If your dog friends have moved or passed away, please notify the town clerk so that they may be removed from the dog list.

Selectboard decides to use ARPA funds to pay down Broadband construction cost

Colrain has been allocated \$486,484 in federal ARPA (American Rescue Plan Act) funds, and the Colrain Selectboard voted on 9/14 to utilize this funding to help reduce our debt for the broadband project. The rationale was that this was the best eligible use in order to equitably benefit every taxpayer.

According to Town Coordinator Kevin Fox, one of the allowable uses for this funding is broadband internet service, and the timing worked out as our system was under construction and incurring costs during the time period allowed. Of the \$486,484 total, \$86,927 has been received and the remainder will be distributed in tranches through Fiscal Year 2022.

Note that the State is the recipient of 3.82 billion *more* in ARPA funding. The House and the Senate recently approved legislation for how to spend this money; the two plans must now be reconciled before going to Governor Baker for his approval.

PFAS Testing - Free to Colrain homeowners

Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection (MassDEP)'s now has a free sampling and analysis program for per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) in private drinking water wells. Because these chemicals have been used in many consumer products over the past 50 years, most people have been exposed to them. PFAS have been found to seep into surface soils, groundwater and surface water, and thereby contaminate drinking water, and exposures have been linked to a variety of health risks.

Because PFAS have been widely used in consumer products, septic systems and landfills may also be sources of PFAS in groundwater. You may wish to sample your well even without knowledge of specific potential sources of PFAS contamination, because many potential sources of PFAS have yet to be identified.

Did you Know?

Did you know that our Colrain Transfer Station is actually able to accept items like **tires, bulky waste (appliances, etc.), scrap metal, and construction waste** on a regular basis? Many Franklin County towns have only one or two dates a year when their special waste can be accepted; we are fortunate that Colrain's schedule is much more open.

Fluorescent bulbs, including compact fluorescent lights (CFLs), some types of batteries, and mercury items are accepted at our Colrain transfer station. Handle carefully and hand to attendant.

In addition, fluorescent light bulbs are accepted at Lowe's Stores (all types), and Home Depot (CFLs only).

Batteries and items such as fluorescent light bulbs, thermometers, and thermostats may contain mercury or heavy metals and should never be put in trash or recycling.

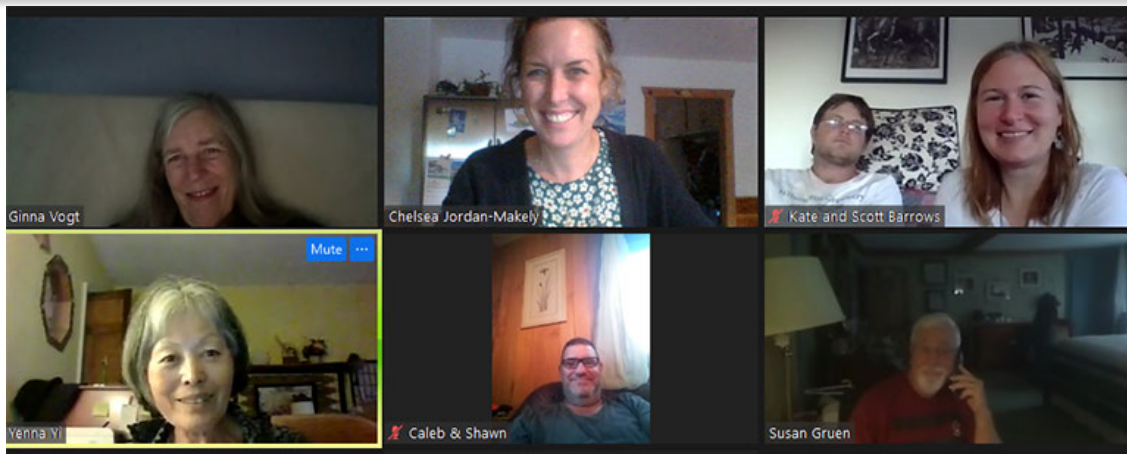

Flushed with pride in the success of our art exhibition, "Colrain on Canvas II," we approach 2022 with hopes for the return of in-person programs in an accessible Stacy Barn, the certification of the Pitt House for use as a museum, and a fresh Colrain on Canvas III.

Beyond their appeal as fundraisers, these popular "Colrain on Canvas" exhibitions of regional art serve to build community in Colrain. We invite your participation as volunteers in these and other Historical Society events. It's fun.

Plans for the coming year—Covid permitting—include a Woodland Garden tour and Christmas house tour fundraisers, and a free, on-site program on the Dude Ranch.

Why all this fundraising? Simply put, when we assumed trusteeship of the Pitt House property last year, we assumed the expense of maintaining,

Catamount

The area of town called Catamount was so called, it is said, because one of the first settlers there in 1736 was chased by one of

Hill.



Heavily wooded, the high, rocky area in northwest Colrain became thickly settled after the Revolutionary War. In 1830 there were 40 farms scratching the stoney soil, and Catamount had the largest school in Colrain. By 1870, 14 farms remained.

Today only the cellar holes of those settlers remain to puzzle hikers in what has reverted to wilderness.
